

Ensuring Food Safety and Security

The features of the closed facility allow area based temperature control suited for products' characteristics as well as reduce the inflow of outdoor air, bugs and dust.

Caring for the Environment by Saving Energy

We utilize natural energy with Tokyo' s largest scale solar power generator as well as implement outdoor air cooling systems, LED lighting and greening.

Efficient Distribution and Responding to New Needs

Smooth distribution is made possible by placing cargo sorting spaces and parking lots near the wholesale markets and intermediate wholesale markets. There is also a processing and packaging facility to process, subdivide and package goods for retailers such as specialty item shops and supermarkets.

Working with the Community to Create Liveliness and Prosperity

We aim to create prosperity in the area beginning with the Senkyaku Banrai Facility Project, as well as opening up the Toyosu Gururi Park surrounding the circumference of the Toyosu district along with the Green Roof Plaza to the public.

About Toyosu Market

As a key market built with the Tokyo Metropolitan Area of 50 years from now in mind, Toyosu Market not only serves to facilitate distribution and stabilize prices for large amounts of fresh foods, which are the roles that Tsukiji Market used to fulfill, the market also responds to the various needs of producers, customers and consumers.

These include realizing food safety, something consumers are increasingly conscious of, and efficient distribution. Moreover, as we make Toyosu Market an environmentally sensitive, progressive market, we also are aiming to increase its appeal and brand power by carrying on and developing the history and tradition built by Tsukiji Market.


Senkyaku Banrai Facility project

The Japanese phrase "senkyaku banrai" means to do roaring business. There are plans to open the Senkyaku Banrai facility in 2023 in Block 6 to carry on and expand on the distinctive liveliness of Tsukiji Market, the functions of which Toyosu Market is inheriting, while creating new energy and excitement unique to Toyosu. Until that time, the Tokyo Metropolitan Government will be working to enliven the market in other ways.



Block 5 Highlights of the Fruit and Vegetables Building!

The Fruit and Vegetables Building contains a wholesale market where fruits and vegetables from Japan and abroad are gathered to be bought and sold, as well as an intermediate wholesale market where restaurants, neighborhood greengrocers and other retailers come to stock up.

1 Market-Related Restaurants and Goods Shops Area

There are four restaurants and one shop in the Fruit and Vegetables Building.

2 Visitors' Course

From the Visitors' Course, visitors can also look through glass windows to see a multi-level, automated, refrigerated warehouse built by the wholesalers and middlemen. The pillars on the course are color-coded according to which vegetables and fruits are in season in different months.



3 Visitors' Deck

There are panels on display that provide information on fruits, vegetables and the business of buying and selling them, and visitors can watch the wholesale market through glass windows in the Visitors' Deck.

(Fruit-and-vegetable auctions occur from 6:30 a.m. for 1 hour)


Highlights of the Fisheries Intermediate Wholesale Market Building and Green Roof Plaza

In the Fisheries Intermediate Wholesale Market Building, many middlemen have shops set up from which they sell the products they bought from wholesalers to fish dealers, sushi restaurants, etc.

1 Market-Related Restaurants

There are 22 restaurants in the Fisheries Intermediate Wholesale Market Building.

2 Visitors' Course

The Viewing Gallery contains panels that provide information on the turret trucks used in the market as well as seasonal fish and cooking methods.

Visitors can also look through glass windows to view activities in the buyers' course of the Fisheries Intermediate Wholesale Market from the Viewing Gallery.

Note: The general public cannot enter the intermediate wholesale market.



3 Uogashi Yokocho (Market-related goods shop area)

Here, shops sell dried fish and other foods, as well as knives, boots and other tools and equipment for people who use the market.

The general public can also use the 70 or so shops found here.



4 Green Roof Plaza


This is a plaza on the rooftop of the Fisheries Intermediate Wholesale Market Building, where trees and other plants have been planted. From here, visitors can see Tokyo Tower, the Rainbow Bridge and other sights. Visitors also can reach Toyosu Gururi Park, which surrounds the Toyosu District, from this plaza.



Block 7 Highlights of the Management Facilities Building and the Fisheries Wholesale Market Building!

Marine products from Japan and abroad are gathered in the Fisheries Wholesale Market Building, where they are sold to middlemen and market participants through auctions and arm's length transactions. Tuna auctions also take place in this building. The Management Facilities Building contains offices of the Tokyo Metropolitan Government and various businesses, as well as a PR center that provides information about the structure and history of the wholesale market.

1 Market-Related Restaurants (Management Facilities Building)

There are 13 restaurants in the Management Facilities Building.

2 PR Center (Management Facilities Building)

Panels showing the structure of the wholesale market and its history since the era of the Nihonbashi riverside fish market are on display. The Tokyo Metropolitan Central Wholesale Market character Ichino is there to greet visitors.



3 Visitors' Hall and Visitors' Course (Fisheries Wholesale Market Building)

Panels providing information on marine products and the business of fisheries as well as a model of a biggest tuna sold at the former Tsukiji Market are on display in the Visitors' Hall, and from the Visitors' Course, visitors can watch the fisheries wholesale market through glass windows. (Tuna auctions take place from 5:30 a.m. for 1 hour.)



4 Tuna Auction Observation Deck (Fisheries Wholesale Market Building)

This deck is in the wholesale market and it allows visitors to experience the tuna auction up close as if they were taking part.



Note : Visitors must register in advance to watch from the deck.
